What is a Home Team?

Home Teams are the small group ministry for adults at Northway Church. Groups consist of 6-16 people and meet at a time and place of their own choosing. Most meet in homes, but some meet on the campus of Northway. In this booklet you will see there are home teams for every age and stage of life. It's a great way to build new friendships while studying the Bible in a relaxed and casual environment.



Home Teams: More important now than ever before!

While there is still plenty of concern regarding the COVID-19 pandemic, we realize there is still some hesitation to meet in groups. That is completely understandable. However, over these last two years, we've also seen the effects of becoming too isolated, especially when it comes to our spiritual lives. Scripture reminds us repeatedly that we are to love one another, encourage one another, pray for one another, and build up one another.

We need others in our lives. What better way is there to do that than through a home team?

If the idea of joining a group makes you uncomfortable, consider....



The idea is simple! You already have friends with whom you feel comfortable and trust. So, invite three friends or couples to join you and "Connect 4" to create a new group. (Of course, your group can have as many or as few as you prefer.) If you form a group, let us know at church and we will come alongside to help you every step of the way. We'll help you select a study with videos, leader's guide, and tips for hosting a group. Try it! You'll like it!

Why should I join a Home Team?

There are two primary reasons for joining a home team:

1—To study and discuss the Bible

Each Home Team will study the Bible whether it's by watching a video together, reading a book, or digging into the scriptures directly. This setting allows for interaction and discussion of Biblical truths and concepts with a group of like-minded people so that we can better apply these principles to our lives.

2—To experience community through new relationships

Everyone desires to belong! In a Home Team, you will make new friends and, in some cases, these may become the people with whom you'll do life; the ones you'll call on in a time of need. In the process you'll experience the truth of what we like to say: "Life is better connected!"

Note: The target audience listed in each group description is merely a guide for the age range of the group, and is not limited to those who may fit that description.







For men of any age whether married or single. This group will be doing a verse-by-verse study of Peter's writings.




Engaged or Newly Married Couples






Celebrate Recovery





CREATE A GROUP!



We realize joining a group where you may not know everyone can sometimes be awkward. If that's you, then grab some of your friends whom you already know and trust and create a group! We'll come alongside you to help with study materials and easy tips for facilitating a group. What are the dates for the Winter semester?

Groups will begin the week of February 6 and conclude the week of April 30. Having specific dates allows you to try out a Home Team without making a long term commitment. However, most who join a group continue with the group for multiple semesters!

How often does a group meet?

Each group sets their own schedule and may meet weekly, bi-weekly, or three times a month.

What's a group meeting like?

Most groups serve refreshments or a meal at the front end of their time together, then enter into their Bible study. Sessions are always very casual and conversational in nature, with the leader facilitating discussion.

How long are group meetings?

Most groups meet about 90 minutes including social time. Some meet longer, some shorter; it all depends on the needs of the group.

What happens after I sign up?

When you sign up, our leadership team will assign you to one of your choices as quickly as possible. The leader of your Home Team will then contact you with all the specific information about your group.

What if I don't see a group that fits my interest or schedule?

Grab a few friends and create a new group! We'll help you get started with all the materials you'll need. Otherwise, contact Phil Anderson, our Connection Pastor as he may be able to direct you to an existing Home Team or a new group that is being formed. What if I'm already in a group?

That's great! We just don't want to assume each person is returning, so all we ask is that you sign up for your group again through this registration process or by contacting your group leader directly. This also ensures that each person is committed to the group for this semester.
